ur journeys to Northern Quebec and other areas over the last few months have left us with a clearer appreciation of the needs of both the people of the region and the Churches there. The relative youthfulness of the Native communities and the overall desire of younger people to advance both personally and as a community are striking.

For instance, there are plans in place to put a Native Community College in place in Val d'Or, Quebec. What an opportunity this presents to launch a First Nations Church and to initiate further training efforts that will serve communities in both Ontario and Quebec!

At the same time, all of the wonderful opportunities that we saw require prepared leadership with a balanced view of life and their own place in the Church. That's why we have emphasized the four key pillars of the Native Lead-

ership Training Centers. We are concerned first with character development, then with Bible knowledge, followed by lead-

ership skills and crowned by a deep understanding of the person and work of the Holy Spirit. The opportunity to prepare community leaders during the summer of 2005 to use both the

"Seedlings" material for children and the "First Things First" discipleship program from Seeds International was grasped immediately by Native leaders during

our meetings. At the same time, there was an enthusiastic response to the idea of taking the various courses in small groups of pastors located in key areas. It now looks as if there will be sufficient interest to begin the pastoral training component of our new program during the Spring of 2005.

The key response, from our perspective, was the willingness to host Howard and Margaret Ellis for their intensive five day personal reconciliation and spiritual growth seminar early in 2005. The corner-

stone of the new model of training and leadership enhancement for Native communities across North America is character development. Please pray with us that a suitable venue can be located that will meet both the needs

of the participants and our budget.

The shape of the present Native Church means that we will

need to train the current leadership "in place." Responsibilities in both their communities and fami-

> lies mean that current Church Leaders simply don't have the luxury of leaving their communities for two or three years of training on campus. Further, the amount of support that

is forthcoming from government educational grants is simply not enough to allow the relocation of whole families for study.

We can now see that the leading of the Holy Spirit has brought us to the edge of a new era of training and meeting the needs of Native communities in a novel way. The delightful reality of this approach is that we are able to meet a variety of needs of people from various age groups and educational backgrounds. At the same time, we will be seeing teams of non-Native people participating in training and outreach activities that will change both their own lives and the lives of everyone that they come in contact with.
