
Through faith based initiatives, we have intentionally provided highly practical training resources which assist in producing effectual balanced lifestyles. These resources can even open the




Temple, Napanee who graciously made their church facility available for the event. Having so many of you involved and participating helped make the night a great success! May the Lord bless you as you have blessed us!

- Once all forms and payment have been received by our office the process takes about 10 days by which time you can have your curriculum and study materials in your hand! If you choose to take your course online....you can be well into your studies in 3-5 days!

SOME COURSE SYNOPSIS

ACTS: THE HOLY SPIRIT AT WORK IN BELIEVERS

• A thorough study of the content, purposes, principles, and applications of Acts. The course emphasizes the role of the Holy Spirit in the early church and today. Attention is given to the geographical, numerical, cultural, and theological growth of the church from Jerusalem to Rome. The journeys of Paul are examined as the background for his epistles.

LOCAL CHURCH IN EVANGELISM

• The local church is the provenance of evangelism for reaching its community and the world. After a foundational, biblical theology of the Great Commission and the Holy Spirit's role in evangelism, this course proposes a comprehensive and integrated approach to evangelism in the local church that avoids over-compartmentalizing evangelism and discipleship.

CONFLICT MANAGEMENT FOR CHURCH LEADERS

• A biblical approach to conflict resolution. This course offers a scriptural way to deal with the inevitable occasions when conflict arises, particularly in a church setting. It offers practical principles for resolving the conflict in a manner that is pleasing to God.
